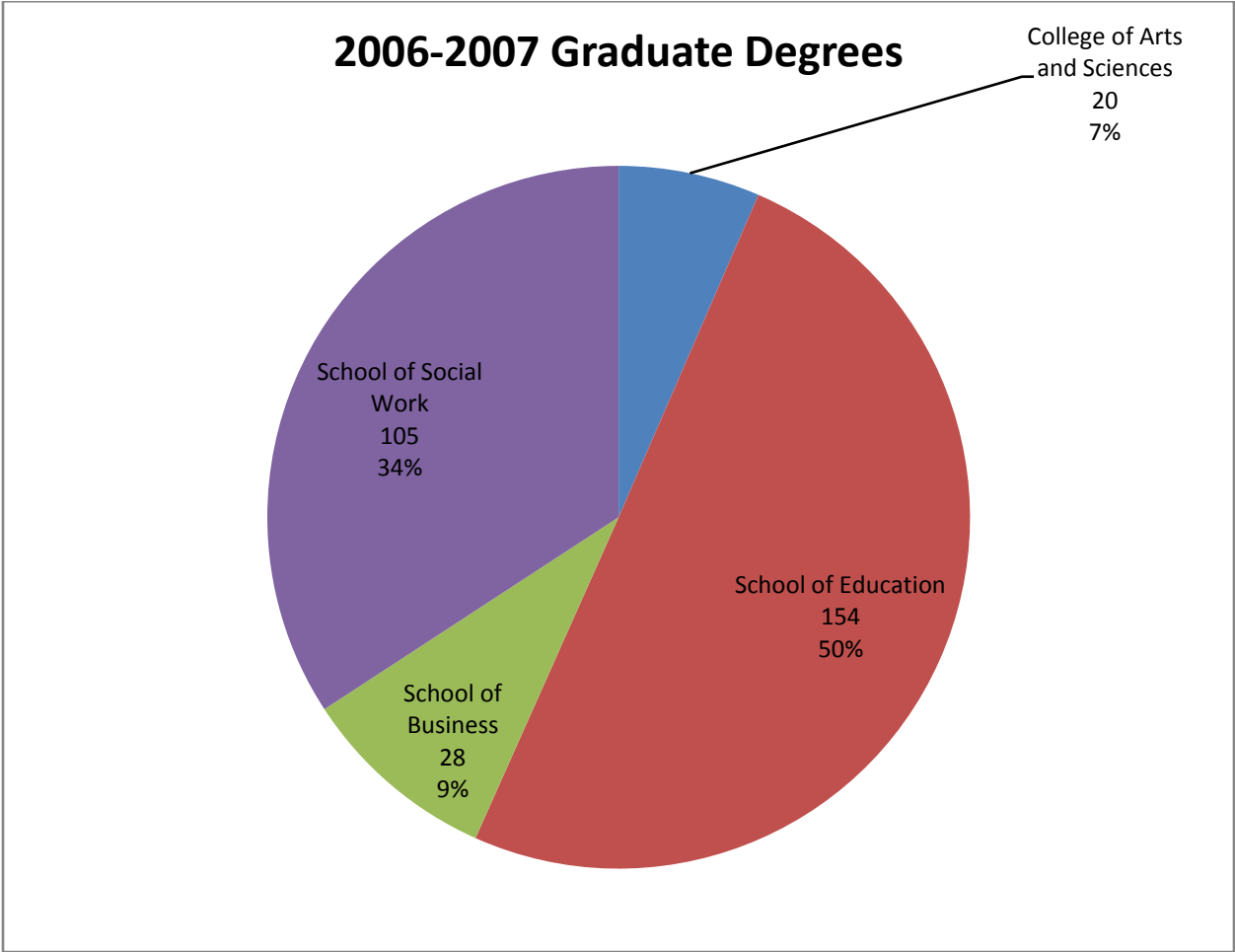

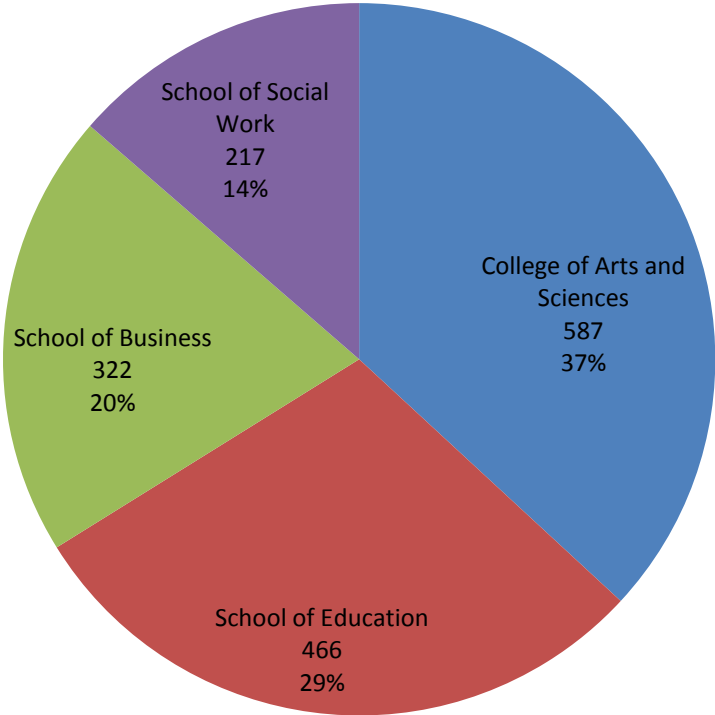


**Distribution of Graduate Degrees Awarded 2006-2007**
