Programs

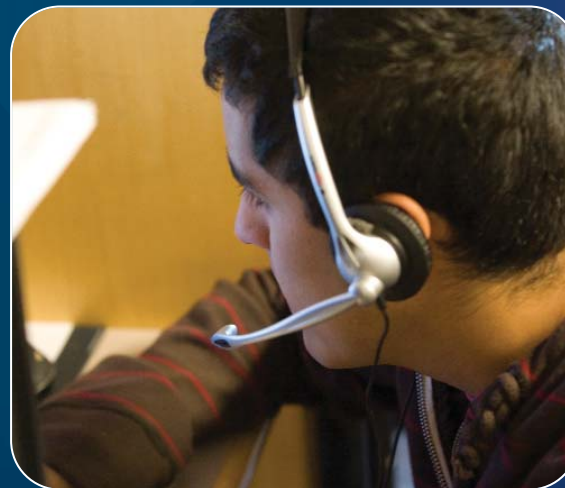
The NMHU Adaptive Technology Center currently has computers with the following software available:

- Kurzweil 3000 - a scanning and reading software.
- Zoomtext - a screen magnifying utility.
- Dragon Naturally Speaking- speech to text software.
- Windoweyes - screen reading software.
- Eclipse Reading Software- designed to specifically designed to work with RFB&D audio textbooks.
- JAWS - screen reading software.

The center also has the following hardware:

- Everest Braille Embosser.
- Fujitsu high-speed scanner.
- Automatic adjustable work stations.
