



**Visiting Professor of Curriculum and Instruction
Full-Time Term Position (Conectado)**

New Mexico Highlands University is an open admissions university with over 70% Hispanic or African American with nearly 40% studying at the Master's Degree level. The university is committed to student success and improved retention and graduation rates. NMHU serves approximately 2,500 undergraduate and graduate students at the main campus in Las Vegas, NM (one hour east of Santa Fe) and another 1300 students at centers in Santa Fe, Rio Rancho, and Albuquerque. The School of Education is comprised of four academic departments including Educational Leadership, Curriculum and Instruction, Teacher Education/Special Education, and Counseling. The Department of Curriculum and Instruction offers an MA in Curriculum and Instruction with diverse emphasis areas in Reading, Bilingual/TESOL, Gifted, and various subject areas. The Department of Curriculum and Instruction is responsible for a wide range of general education courses for graduate students such as *Statistics for Educators*, *Research Interpretation*, *Advanced Educational Psychology*, *Principles of Curriculum and Instruction*, and *Socio-cultural Factors Affecting Education*. In addition to the general education courses, the Department of Curriculum and Instruction provides the full range of reading courses for both graduate and undergraduate students. The individual selected for this position, funded by CONECTADO Grants, is invited for a nine-month term faculty position with a contract starting in **January 2018**. This position requires experience with teaching quantitative (Statistics) and qualitative research classes.

Job Duties: Faculty contractual duties include teaching a full load equivalent to four courses (12 Credit Hours) per semester or the equivalent of 24 credit hours per Academic Year. A successful candidate will be required to teach 90% via online (asynchronous/synchronous) and serve on departmental and school committees, and assist with advising/mentoring graduate students while working with current faculty to build an education program. The successful candidate will also show potential for an active research agenda, maintain regular attendance, and perform other related duties as assigned.

Minimum Requirements: Minimum requirements include a Doctoral degree in the area of Curriculum and Instruction, Literacy or closely related area. The candidate must demonstrate his/her capability of teaching graduate course work in General Education including research methodologies that pertain to GNEED 605 Statistics for Educators and GNEED 610 Research Interpretation. The candidate will have two or more years of teaching experience in higher education and two or more years of successful teaching experience in public schools, and direct experience with curriculum development. The candidate must have experience utilizing technology in the classroom to include areas such as online synchronous, online asynchronous, blended/hybrid, web conferencing and learning management systems.

Preferred Requirements: The preferred candidate will have experience providing outreach to

first generation college students and demonstrated experience in forming partnerships with school districts.

Procedure: A complete application must include: 1) A letter of application describing teaching and research interests, 2) Curriculum Vitae, 3) Unofficial copies of advanced degree transcripts, and 4) Name, address, telephone number and e-mail address of three current professional references.

Minimum Salary: Starting at \$48,000

While the position is open until filled, review of applications will begin immediately.
