



## Summer Camp Jobs

**2018 Dates:** July 2-July 29, 2018

**Applications Due:** Rolling, due May 31

**Location:** Cleveland/Mora New Mexico

**Classification:** Seasonal, exempt

**Compensation:** \$900-\$1,200 for full residential season depending on experience and role. Room and board are included as a residential camp.

**Qualifications:** 18+; high school grad-some college preferred; Some experience significant to working with children in a camp setting; Familiarity and compatibility with Quaker values

**Mountain Friends Camp** is a residential, co-ed camp affiliated with Intermountain Yearly Meeting of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) for youth ages 10-15. At camp,

everyone takes responsibility for the well being of the community, from deciding on “norms” to washing dishes to making sure that everyone is having fun. We live simply and in harmony with the natural environment and have a great time exploring, learning and sharing. We welcome campers and staff members from diverse religious, geographic, racial, gender, ability, and economic backgrounds, and staff should be prepared to actively engage with differences and challenge assumptions. Please reflect on what it takes to create a community based around Quaker testimonies of peace, simplicity, integrity, equality, community, and stewardship, and your preparedness to handle challenges, hard work and very limited personal time. ### Program Manager

New position in 2018, we’re seeking strong, collaborative leadership to partner with the Director in managing our camp program operations. You should have at least 3 years experience at residential summer camp, with Quaker background through a Meeting, camp or school strongly preferred. Position may be shared between two people, and will be residential July 1-29, with possible remote start date for part time work in late May or June.

### Program Staff/Camp Counselors

Counselors form the heart and soul of the camp each summer, so we’re looking for outstanding role models and leaders. Many counselors are also lifeguards, drivers, program specialists (eg with CIT, arts & crafts, wilderness), and medic/assistant medic. As a team, you’re responsible for planning and leading activities using your own creativity, talents, and values. Most counselors are assigned to a cabin/yurt group, others will “float” as needed to cover days off . Lifeguard training can be paid for by camp!

### Kitchen Staff

Our kitchen staff are full members of the camp community, and participate in a wide range of activities in and out of the kitchen. We cook healthy, tasty meals, and help campers feel at home, try new things, and refuel for long active days. Campers learn about cooking and maintaining a kitchen through helping with lunches and clean up every day, so cooks need to be comfortable engaging and supervising young people. We’re seeking one or two kitchen managers responsible for planning menus, purchasing ingredients, and managing cook shifts, with a remote part time start date in late May or June.

### Medic

Our camp medics are responsible for leadership and guidance in health, hygiene and safety precautions, as well as responding to injuries or illnesses. Wilderness First Responder or higher level training is required, for which the camp may be able to reimburse fees. With our small size and proximity to health clinics in Mora and hospitals in Las Vegas or Taos, our resident medics will also take on program and/or kitchen responsibilities. We also welcome full or part time help from camp nurse, PA or MD!
