Why does the job exist?

To provide direct social work services to a multi-ethnic population including, but not limited to, mono-lingual Spanish speaking families and Native American clientele. Provide a safety net and assurance services for children and youth with special healthcare needs. Services and concerns are addressed on both an individual/family level and on a systems level.

How does it get done?

Assist families of children (ages 0-21), in developing a coordinated plan to meet the child's medical, social, and developmental needs. Service coordination consists of several components including: outreach and engagement of clients/families, providing a complete biopsychosocial assessment and periodic reassessment regarding client's/family's needs, the development and implementation of a service plan, the coordination and monitoring of service delivery and advocacy on behalf of the client including linkage to needed services. Additionally, the Social Worker works collaboratively with medical, educational, vocational and human service providers. Additional goals/components including providing needed outreach to the immigrant and Native American /Pueblo communities. Provide quality assurance for billing and maximizing billing and on-going care coordination and thereby produces revenue to support the program.
