Two 2-credit electives are required to complete your BSW degree. Electives are taken within the School of Social Work and can be taken as long as all 3000-level courses have been completed.

Please note that a total of 120 total credit hours are required for completion of the BSW degree. This includes 53 credit hours of social work courses, in addition to your core requirements. Please work with Faculty Advisors, Student Support Specialists, and the Registrar to ensure you are on track.
