These entities can propose projects for forest restoration that reduce the threat of wildfire, improve communication and joint problem solving and encourage sustainable communities and forests through collaborative partnerships. Grants are for projects that restore forests on public and/or tribal land, improve the use of small trees thinned from those lands, demonstrate local and traditional knowledge, include current scientific information, create healthy, productive forests and watersheds, incorporate a multiparty monitoring plan, and create local jobs and training opportunities.
