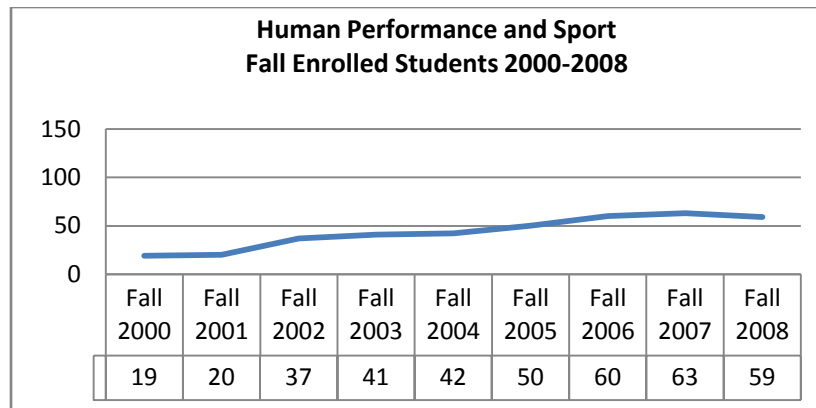
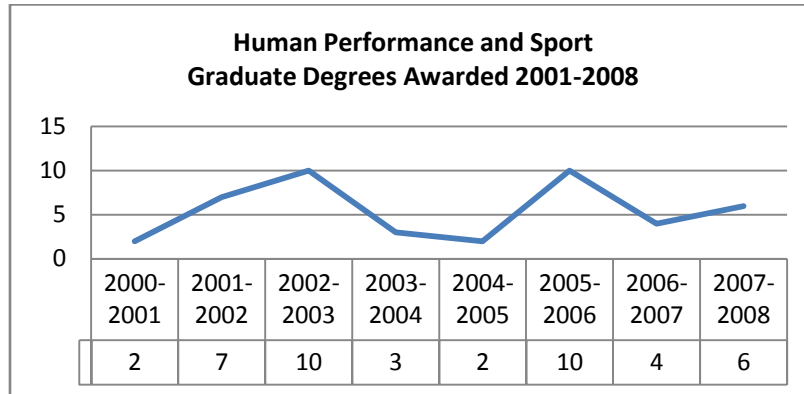
Chemistry Graduate Program



English Graduate Program

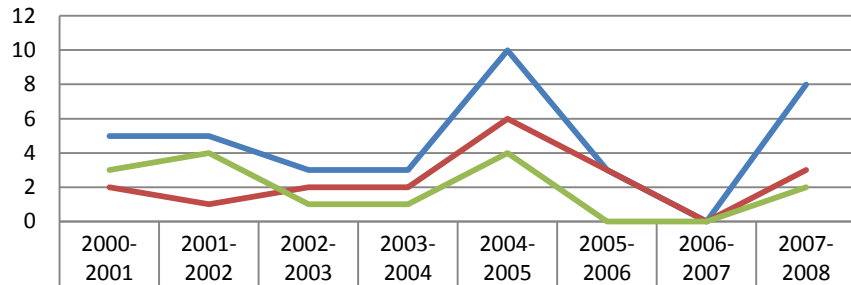

Although it is too early to present meaningful data on this program, it is worth mentioning that, although students in this program are officially enrolled in both programs, they are only counted in one or the other in the above fall enrollment charts (which ever program they were first admitted to). There are currently 25 students who have been admitted to both programs and in the future these students will have to tracked separately from other graduate students in those programs.
