

Graduation Rates by Campus

Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Research, February 2009

This report is designed to give a general idea of undergraduate and graduate student graduation rates by NMHU campus. The first table shows all the undergraduate students enrolled in the fall, 2000 semester and what percentages had earned degrees within 4, 5 or 6 years. The second table shows all the degree-seeking graduate students enrolled in the fall of 2003 and what percentages had earned degrees in 4 or 5 years. These method of calculating graduation rates differs from other reports generated by OIER in that the other reports generally take a specific cohort of students (such as all first-time freshmen admitted in a specific semester) and then presents graduation rates for those students.

The Centers have higher graduation rates than the main campus because the Centers enroll only transfer students, not first-time freshmen. For a discussion of the differences in graduation rates between first-time freshmen and transfer students see other reports on this web site.
