#### 8.1 Criminal Justice Revision

The Criminal Justice program has increasing enrollments, there is strong interest among prospective students. The intent of the proposed revision is to make the Criminal Justice more rigorous. Increase rigor is sought by adding 3 required courses to the curriculum, two of which are research and theory courses. The number of credit hours for required courses is proposed to be increased from 18 to 28. Two new electives are proposed for addition to the program: Law Enforcement, and Terrorism. The Criminal Justice program benefits the Public Affairs MA program because of the 30 graduates from the CJ program, about 5 to 6 go on to the Public Affairs MA.

A motion to approve the Criminal Justice revision was made by Dr. Kempner and seconded by Dr. LeRoy. The Committee voted unanimously to approve the Criminal Justice Revision.
