


c. Use of Results to Improve Instructional Program:

Department members will meet in the Spring of 2011, seeking means to promote more sophisticated treatment of the scholarly literature in written assignments in order to prepare students for the demands of theses or professional papers. One proposal to be considered is the establishment of a new class or classes providing advanced graduate students with more dedicated mentorship in this aspect of writing. (It should be noted that some efforts along these lines have been made in the new Public Affairs concentration in History, and it may well warrant making similar changes in our concentration in Southwest Studies as well).

Final Observations: The Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Research has in previous years provided data on graduation rates and enrollments for the graduate programs at New Mexico Highlands University, and the information provided for Southwest Studies are particularly illuminating:¹

Enrollments for the program as a whole have been flat, and the number of degrees awarded per year has remained low overall; the concentration in History & Political Science has been particularly hard-hit. Along with the data presented above, this indicates the need for a systematic examination of the program, in order to identify specific problems and remedies.
