

PsycARTICLES includes all journal articles, book reviews, letters to the editor and errata from each journal. It also offers extensive backfile

On the Databases by Subject webpage, select Social Work. Each database listed will have a brief description of its contents under its title. To access a database, click on the hyperlinked title of the database.

Note: To locate research articles in a database, limit your search to scholarly or peer-reviewed journals. This option is usually on the first page of the database's search screen.

If you are not sure where to begin, start your search in one of our general databases, using the links at the top of the page.

Suggested Database for Legal Research LexisNexis Academic

For access to full-text documents from over 5,600 news, business, legal, medical, and reference publications.



How to Find an Article If You Have a Citation

1. Identify the journal title in the citation.

Note: When looking for a specific article, the journal title is the key. The database identified in a citation is not as important as the journal title, since the contents of specific databases will change over time.

- 2. Go to the Libraries' webpage.
- 3. Select the Journal Finder link located at the top left menu on the Library home page.
- 4. On the Journal Finder webpage, type in the journal title & click search.
- 5. Review years available. (Refer to the article citation for the year, volume and issue the article appears in. The dates of full-text coverage for the various databases are indicated in the Journal Finder descriptions).
- 6. Select a database that has the needed year and click on the hyperlink for that database.

Note: In the case that full-text coverage is not available, consider requesting the article through Interlibrary Loan (see below).

7. In the database search box, type in the title of the article; click on the full text icon to view the article.
