Beisman Collection

- Collection relating to surveying and land use of northeastern New Mexico.
- Donated by the heirs of Henry Beisman, and includes records of J. B. Franzini, V. K. Jones, and George Zimmerman
- Includes:
 - Survey and plat maps
 - Field notebooks
 - Plat descriptions
 - Surveying equipment
 - Business records
 - Early books on surveying

University Archives

- Contains the permanently valuable, but non-current records of the University
- Provides a historical, legal, and financial record of Highlands and its many parts
- Includes copies of student theses, books written by faculty, and books about the University.



- Undergraduate students may have 5 outstanding requests, or 10 with the permission of an instructor.
- Community patrons may have 3 outstanding requests.


