 - a. General Faculty voted to approve the Undergraduate Advising Manual, moving to Administration approval. <u>comments</u>, <u>only FS has authority to approve SAC issues (except student rulings).</u>
- 5. Reports from ex officio members Jessica: phone bank events will continue to occur from lists of first-time fresh., transfer, and applicants who haven't completed applications. We have three Admissions Counselors on campus and at the Centers.

 Emmanuel: Freshmen tend to not be retained, so wider areas of students need to be considered for recruitment. Also new freshmen are required to stay in Las Vegas. Jessica: We're also recruiting non-traditional and graduate populations. Emmanuel: Business

classes are maxed out, so more faculty are needed. Jessica: Also expanding transfer agreements with places like CNM. Also Reverse Transfers policies will help both students and institutions. Do we need FYE experiences for transfer students? Peter:

Advising issues with transfer students need to be considered. Joseph: Freshmen are required to purchase meal plans in order to keep food services available for the campus. Our school is near the bottom of freshmen retention rates in NM. Peter: HLC stats look mostly at 4 & 6 year graduation rates for students who entered as freshmen. Jessica: We have spaces in East & West schools and scheduled events at both.
