- I. Call to Order by Chair Zollner at 1:00 p.m.
- II. Agenda

- IV. Director's Report and Associate Director's Report (Ruben Aragon and April Kent)
 - a. ACRL/Core Facilities Survey completed in September.
 - b. Conferences and Meetings
 - i. NeNMLG meeting on 9/27.
 - c. Budget
 - i. 58% of I&G budget has been spent.
 - ii. 38% of the 2022 Library GO Bond has been spent.
 - iii. Working with Purchasing, CPFA, and interim ITS Director regarding exemptions related to library.
 - iv. 2024 Library GO Bond is on the November 5 ballot.
 - d. Building
 - i. Odor in elevator was alleviated by facilities.
 - ii. Couches from Kennedy Hall were moved to the library.
 - e. Interviews for Library Associate-Acquisitions scheduled with the top 3 candidates on October 29.
 - f. Meeting with 10 library staff members regarding changes to the Fair Labor Standards Act.
 - g. New Printing Policy
 - i. Response to the closure of the Purple Pub.
 - ii. 20 pages of printing are allowed per student every day. There are no restrictions if students bring their own paper.
 - h. Library Assessment Survey: 10/15-11/12.
- V. Library Instruction and Collections Report (Patrick Baumann)
 - a. Top five LibGuides: nursing, FV School of SW, social work, OERs for All, education.
 - b. E-reserves have been switched to LibGuides (34 coursess available).
 - c. A voting LibGuide has been developed.
 - d. 4 sections of LIBR 1110, one section of LIBR 4000, and one section of LIBR 5000 have been offered in the fall. 3 sections of LIBR 1110, 1 section of LIBR 4000, and 1 section of LIBR 5000 are being offered in the Spring. All are online asynchronous.

- VI. Archives and Cataloging Report (Katie Gray)
 - a. 87 items added to the catalog in September. 5 were withdrawn.
 - b. Beisman Collection
 - i. The online Beisman index has been inoperable since the network disruption. An ITS work order was submitted in April. Submitted another request on 10/10.
 - ii. Student worker continues to work on index of digitized collection of plat descriptions.
 - c. Rio Gallinas Acequia Association: digitized legacy index is being cross-references with materials in the library.
 - d. Dr. Frank Angel's family has contacted the library and are interested in donating materials.
 - e. Instruction
 - i. English 6010 (Dr. Schneider): 3 students, English 1110 (May): 14.

 - g. Participated in website editing training. Now knows how to update the site.
