- Students completing the Associate of Arts in Human Services at Central New Mexico Community College can apply those credits and courses directly toward one of the Bachelors of Social Work at New Mexico Highlands University.
- The Bachelor of Social Work program is offered locally at the NMHU Albuquerque Campus.
- The transfer and articulation of the commonly numbered coursework within this articulation agreement is supported by The Post-Secondary Education Articulation Act, 21-1B, NMSA 1978.
- This Articulation Agreement is designed to guide students in earning their Associate of Arts in Human Services and completing their New Mexico General Education Core and any prerequisite requirements for the Bachelors of Social Work.
- Students that earn their Associate of Arts and transfer to NMHU will be granted a waiver for NMHU's proficiency, extended core, outstanding state core, and minor requirements.
- This transfer agreement will be reviewed by CNM and NMHU each academic year, by the Office of Academic Affairs at CNM and the Registrar at NMHU.
- This Transfer Articulation Agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years.


