ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

University of New Mexico Gallup (UNM Gallup)

and

New Mexico Highlands University (NMHU)

Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) Completion Program

This formal program of articulation is made and entered into by the University of New Mexico Gallup (UNM Gallup) and New Mexico Highlands University (NMHU). This agreement expresses a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for UNM Gallup students to have access to and success in higher education by clarifying transfer policies and procedures that assure articulation between programs and to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate degree in Human Services the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree at NMHU. UNM Gallup students who earn an Associate degree in Human Services can apply the courses identified below directly toward graduation requirements of the Bachelor of Social Work degree at NMHU.

The mission of the Human Services Program at UNM Gallup is to provide the required general education courses and specific electives that support students transferring to the BSW Program. Courses offered by the Human Services Program provide a beginning foundation for further study and practice in Social Work that prepares students for culturally-competent generalist practice and to promote social and economic justice on behalf of the peoples of the Southwest region.

The BSW Program at NMHU prepares generalist social work practitioners with the knowledge, skills, values and ethical principles necessary to practice with Hispanic, American Indian, and other diverse populations of New Mexico and the Southwest.

Conditions of Transfer

Acceptance into the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited BSW Program is competitive and based upon a student's past academic performance and admission requirements for the Bachelor of Social Work degree. A grade point average of 2.5 is required for admission to the BSW Program.

Transfer students from UNM Gallup who have completed the Associate Degree in Human Services will have junior standing at NMHU upon acceptance into the Bachelor of Social Work Program.

UNM Gallup students, upon admission to the BSW Program, have the opportunity to apply for the Title IV-E stipend which provides financial support to BSW graduates that work for New Mexico's Children, Youth, and Families Department upon graduation.

Courses not completed with a letter grade of C or better may not count toward completion of NMHU requirements. Courses transfer at the level offered at UNM Gallup and cannot be used for upper division (300-400) courses.

Students completing an Associate of Arts Degree in Human Services are waived from NMHU's Physical Education (2 credit hours), English Literature (3 credit hours) and Language Other Than English (8 credit hour) requirements.

Students completing the Bachelor of Social Work must complete a minimum of 128 credit hours with a GPA of 2.5 to continue in and complete the program. Students completing UNM Gallup's Associate Degree in Human Services (with 65 credit hours) and 52 credit hours of required social work classes will need an additional 11 elective credit hours to complete the 128 credit hour minimum. It is highly recommended that students complete all 76 credit hours of pre-requisite coursework prior to beginning the BSW program. This requires advance planning and students are encouraged to meet with Karilyn Haozous, Academic Advisor, NMHU School of Social Work at Albuquerque, as early as possible.

65 credit hours Associate of Arts Degree in Human Services
11 credit hours Extra Electives
+52 credit hours NMHU BSW courses
128 credit hours required for BSW degree

Undergraduate social work students have the opportunity to apply to the graduate/Master of Social Work Advanced Standing Program at the end of their junior year. If admitted, students can enroll into one of the MSW concentrations upon completion of the BSW degree and can complete the MSW within two academic semesters.
