The Master of Arts in Public Affairs is an interdisciplinary program in the Social Sciences that provides academic training for careers in public and private organizations, both nationally and internationally. The multidisciplinary core curriculum includes courses in political theory, social theory and historical thought, human culture and economic theory. These courses foster a comprehensive understanding of the social and cultural environment or public and private organizational policy design and implementation. The program prepares students for professional positions in managerial and leadership roles in government agencies, consulting firms, human services, public-interest organizations and businesses significantly affected by public policies, as well as training them for doctoral studies.

Interpretation of Results for Outcome 1:

A total of three MPA graduate students enrolled in one-to-two interdisciplinary core courses taking four-of-five core courses. All three students acquired a grade of "B" or better in four of the five core classes. The cumulative GPA for the three students was 3.8 or better. Successful completion of this outcome was met.

Utilization of Results:

The Outcomes Assessment process provided the Political Science faculty with useful information for the development of the MA in Public Affairs, concentration in Political and Governmental Processes.

- Little to no resources are allocated to the recruitment into the Graduate program. Many of
 our undergraduate students, upon completion of their BA in Political Science and who meet
 the requirements for the graduate program, are accepted into the Public Affairs program.
 Given our limited resources, in particular—one-to-two Political Science faculty in a given
 semester—the interdisciplinary core courses provide our students with the opportunity to
 take classes from Historians, Sociologist and Anthropologists; as a result, students obtain a
 comprehensive approach to the study of political processes, governmental entities, and
 community.
- 2) The research courses (POLS520 and POLS620) along with Public Administration and Public Policy provide students with the necessary tools to apply historical research techniques to public policy issues. Moreover, the acquisition of quantitative methods provides students with the skills need for policy analysis and evaluation. Also, students in Political Science have benefitted from their training in GIS. Political Science faculty are interested in developing a certification in GIS for the Social Sciences.
- 3) The successful outcome—four of five graduate students (80 percent)—continuing into Law School or a Ph.D. program or secure a job in the state government suggests that the courses we are providing students are preparing them for excellent job opportunities in their fields on interest.

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4) Our department has discussed creating a four-plus-one Master degree program for students who receive a BA in Political Science and move into our Public Affairs Master's program. Also, our department has had informal meetings with the Business department to create an MA in Business and Public Administration. Both "new" programs would generate an increase in graduate students for the Department of History and Political Science.
