Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Multicultural Education: Age 3 to Grade 3

or

Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Multicultural Education: Birth to Age 4 Non-Licensure

- Students completing the Associate of Arts in Early Childhood Education at Clovis Community College can apply those credits and courses directly toward one of the Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Multicultural Education: Birth to Age 4 at New Mexico Highlands University
- The transfer and articulation of the commonly numbered coursework and New Mexico general education core structure within this articulation agreement is in alignment with the Post-Secondary Education Articulation Act, 21-1B, NMSA 1978.
- This Articulation Agreement is designed to guide students towards earning their Associate of Arts in Early Childhood Education and completing their New Mexico General Education Core and any prerequisite requirements for the Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Multicultural Education
- Students that earn their Associate of Arts and transfer to NMHU will be granted a waiver for NMHU's proficiency, extended core, and outstanding state core.
- This transfer agreement will be revised by CCC and NMHU each academic year, by the Office of the Executive Vice President of Academic Affairs at CCC and the Registrar at NMHU.
- This Transfer Articulation Agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years


